#### Principal's Message

#### School Safety

I would like to take the opportunity to remind all of our students and families that safe behaviours when riding and scootering to school are vital to avoid serious or potentially fatal injuries to students as they travel to and from school.



#### Safety tips for cycling and scootering

If your child is in primary school, ride with them until they are confident. Once they have the skills and feel safe, try to find a friend from their school they can ride with.

Teach your child:

- the safest route to school (such as on a bike path or through suburban streets)
- to ride on the left side of the road, at least 1 metre from the curb (if they are in high school and feel comfortable), or on the footpath (if they are in primary school or not confident at cycling)
- to try and stay 1 metre behind vehicles or bikes in front of them
- to wear their helmet correctly (so that it cannot move back or forward when they move their head)
- understand the bike/scooter road rules
- that they shouldn't ever 'double' their friends
- to ride with a maximum of 2 cyclists side by side
- what to do in an emergency—it's a good idea to have them carry a mobile with emergency numbers on speed dial
- to use hand signals to let others know where they are going and what they are doing

We encourage all families whether they ride to school or not to start a conversation about safety riding that may save their lives in the future.






# What We Are Learning at North Shore




## Book Week 2022

## Visit by Registered Nurse for Free Prep Vision Screening

Good vision is important for a child's educational, physical and social development. Vision screening checks for common eye conditions that may impact your child's ability to see and therefore impact their learning and development.

A Registered Nurse will be visiting the school on/between 5 – 8 SEPTEMBER 2022 to conduct vision screening for children in their prep year. Your child does not need a Medicare card in order to participate in screening. If you wish to have your prep child participate in this free vision screening program, please complete a consent form by 01/08/2022 Online or paper consent forms are available and will be distributed to you. Parents do not need to be present for screening, however if you would like to be, please contact the school to arrange this.

If your child's vision is screened, you will be advised of the results in writing. If a vision concern is found, you will receive a phone call from the nurse to discuss referral to an eye health professional for further assessment. If a vision concern is identified and your child requires glasses, eligible health care card holders may be assisted with free basic glasses through the Spectacle Supply Scheme.

Participation in vision screening is not compulsory. If you do not wish for your child to participate in screening, please complete the consent form and indicate that you wish to decline screening.



# DON'T LET A LOST DENTAL FORM RUIN YOUR CHILD'S CHANCE TO SEE THE DENTAL VAN

The Dental Van is now at your child's school providing free check-ups and treatment. If you have a child enrolled at the school and they hold a current Medicare Card, then they are eligible to receive free dental care.

To access the service, dental forms must be completed by a parent or guardian.

'2<sup>nd</sup> issue' forms are being sent out after the holidays to those who may have forgotten or misplaced their original one.

Late dental forms will still be accepted.

# The Dental Van is back

The Dental Van is now at your child's school providing free checkups and treatment. If you have a child enrolled at the school and they hold a current Medicare Card, then they are eligible to receive free dental care.

If you have not received a form home and you would like your child to visit the Dental Van, please collect a new form from the school office

## Student Council News

Congratulations to our 2022 student council representatives. The student council is involved in recycling ventures around North Shore State School as well as various fundraising events to raise money for playtime equipment for students from Prep – year 6. This year the following are occurring:

-POPPER RECYCLING: Students are encouraged to place their empty poppers with straws removed into the recycling tubs in their village.

-ICY CUPS: Student council representatives make and sell icy cups. These are for sale from the Hall Kitchen on Friday afternoons immediately after the end of day bell for \$1.

-ORAL HYGIENE RECYCLING: Terra Cycle collect old toothbrushes, electric tooth brush heads, empty toothpaste tubes and floss containers and turn these into furniture. A box for collections is in Mrs Gardem's classroom, once the box weighs 5kg it is sent back and we are issued credits towards resources.

-SMENCILS FUNDRAISING: In Term 2 student council representatives will be selling Smencils (Smelly lead pencils made from recycled newspapers) for \$2 a pencil in the CAM on Friday mornings until they are sold out. Get in quick to collect the 10 difference scents and designs.

#### BPOINT is the new preferred Payment Method for North Shore State School

North Shore State School now allows you to pay student invoices online rather than having to send in cash or pay via EFTPOS.

On the bottom of each invoice that you receive, the BPOINT payment method symbol will be displayed with a website link for you to visit and process your online payment (very similar to internet banking that you might currently utilise). You can use a credit or bank debit card to make a payment.

You do not need to register for BPOINT, simply visit the link detailed below and enter Customer Reference Number (CRN), invoice number, student name and exact amount of individual invoice.

The CRN will appear on school invoices and will not change.

BPOINT will issue you with a payment confirmation that you can email to yourself, or you can print or take a screen shot for your records. If you would like an official receipt, please request it from the school office.

You may still pay by cheque, cash, EFTPOS or credit card. BPOINT reduces processing work for office staff so is the preferred method.

#### IMPORTANT POINTS TO REMEMBER

- Log into <a href="http://www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete">http://www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete</a>
- · Pay each invoice separately
- Use your CRN (Customer Reference Number) from the invoice
- · Check the invoice amount carefully and pay the exact amount









#### Excursions/ Events

When planning an excursion or event there is a lot of planning that is required and sometimes we need to generate an invoice before sending out the permission slip.

This is required as it is an overnight process and so we are then ready to take payments the next day.

Due to the setup of Department of Education's systems these invoices will be automatically emailed to the parents email address that we have on file.

Participation in these events is optional and if you do not take up the offer then we will credit the invoice after the event finishes.

### Payment Policy for Extra-curricular activities
